

**APPLICATION FOR A PILOTAGE EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE
FOR THE DEE ESTUARY PILOTAGE AREA**

Preliminary Notes

- 1) Prior to completing this application, the Mostyn Docks Ltd. Pilotage Directions and The Dee Estuary Pilotage Area – Pilotage Regulations must be thoroughly read and understood.
- 2) The last 3 pages of this form must be completed in English, typewritten or printed in block capitals in black or blue ink throughout, and countersigned by the owner of the vessel, or by a senior officer of the company on his behalf.
- 3) The form is to be submitted to the Harbour Master's Office together with the appropriate fee, and evidence of medical fitness, including eyesight, by a medical practitioner equivalent to that required under the Merchant Shipping (Medical Examination) Regulations 2002 as amended or, if for a vessel other than a U.K. registered vessel, the equivalent National Maritime medical certificate.
- 4) The Examination will consist of two parts:
 - a) Practical examination, consisting of a pilotage act whereby the applicant will demonstrate to the Harbour Master or Senior Pilot his or her ship handling abilities, and the thorough understanding of their own vessels handling characteristics including squat and interaction. The applicant will also need to demonstrate; the ability to communicate effectively in English, their local knowledge, compliance with the Dee Estuary Pilotage Area – Pilotage Regulations, and their ability to prepare, implement and monitor an effective pilotage plan. For vessels of less than 50 metres length overall, the pilotage act may be waived at the discretion of the examiner, providing the remaining elements can be demonstrated effectively.
 - b) A formal examination, conducted by the Harbour Master or Senior Pilot, which may be observed by a pilot or Port official, whereby the applicant will demonstrate relevant and applicable knowledge in regard to their own vessel and the Port of Mostyn Competent Harbour Authority (CHA) area in each of the following elements:

Port and Pilotage Regulations,
The Port Marine Safety Code,
The National Occupational Standards for Marine Pilots,
The Pilotage Act 1987,
Speed Limits,
Local Notices to Mariners,
Vessel Traffic Service / Local Port Service,
VHF Communications,
Sound Signals,
Aids to Navigation, and other marks,
Restricted visibility procedures,
Coastal features,
Tidal streams and prevailing winds,
Anchorage areas / prohibited anchor areas (pipelines, etc.),
Tide limits and constraints, depths in channel and heights of
banks, channel tracks and distances, maximum air draft and
height of bridges,
Use of tide boards and remote tide gauges,
Berths and depths alongside,
Emergency Plans and Oil Spill Contingency Plans,
Abort positions and passing points,
Local traffic patterns including workboats fishing vessels
and recreational craft.

- 5) Upon satisfactory examination a PEC will be issued by the Harbour Authority entitling the holder to navigate the named vessel(s) over the whole of, or part of the Dee Estuary Pilotage Area as examined upon and specified on his / her certificate. The Certificate will be valid for a period of 12 months only but may be revalidated without examination provided that the minimum tripping requirements are completed in the 12 month period since the certificate was issued or last revalidated and that evidence of continued medical fitness, including eyesight is produced. However all PEC holders will be re-assessed and re-examined at intervals not exceeding 5 years, and Mostyn Docks Ltd may at its discretion require an applicant for renewal of a PEC to submit for re-assessment and re-examination at any time.
- 6) In the event that a PEC applicant requires more than one vessel to be named on the certificate, then if the vessels differ significantly in size or manoeuvring characteristics then the applicant will need to demonstrate proficiency by practical examination in each vessel.
- 7) If an applicant is unsuccessful in examination the reasons will be fully explained to them, and they may reapply for examination after a further 3 trips have been completed.
- 8) An application for revalidating a PEC is the responsibility of the holder and must be made at least 14 days prior to the expiry of the existing PEC.
